Church of England Safeguarding Audit

The Church of England are taking part in an independent safeguarding audit, (carried out by the INEQE Safeguarding Group) to make sure Dioceses and Cathedrals are doing all they can to create environments where everyone feels safe, valued and respected. St James' Kitchen

- Water Heater: We have now had several occasions when the Tray under neath the Heater has a lot of water left. If this gets to the top of the tray it will spill over onto the work surface and the floor. The problem is arising because people are removing the drip tray to put pots/cups underneath and pull the item away before turning off the tap. If water falls onto the main tray, please use the green soak cloth /or the white towel in the sink cupboard to put round the heater to soak up the excess. A small sponge will get underneath the Tank. Please do not leave water to stagnate. Thank you. *Rose*
