Thurs: For or an end to the Ethiopian Civil Conflict (Ethiopia, Eritrea, Sudan) ongoing since 2018. 395,00-

800,000 deaths to date.

Fri: For an end to Colombian Conflict in Colombia, Venezuela, Ecuador ongoing since 1964. 453,000+ deaths to date.

Sat: For an end to the Afghanistan conflict (IS - Taliban) ongoing since 1978. 1.45-2.58 million + deaths to date.
