Knitted exhibition to mark the 80th anniversary of the D Day landings

There will be an exhibition at Southwell Minster called 'the Longest Yarn' which has been knitted by over 1,000 knitters from all over the world, it is an 80m 3D depiction of that fateful day in wool art, with 80 displays, each measuring one metre in length, depicting scenes of the world's largest amphibious invasion.
