Praying for peace in Ukraine 100,00-350,000+ deaths since 2014. And a different area each day

Sun: And for an end to the Somali Civil War (with Kenya) ongoing since 1991. 513,000 - 1,000,000 deaths to date.

Mon: And for an end to Allied Democratic Forces insurgency in Africa (DR Congo and Uganda) ongoing since 1996, 9,000+ deaths to date.

Sat: And for an end to the Kivu conflict (DR Congo, Rwanda, Burundi) ongoing since 2004. 25,000+ deaths to date.
