#### Nominations for lay people to join the Diocesan Synod

The Diocese of Leicester are currently seeking nominations for the elections to Diocesan Synod for the three year period starting on 1<sup>st</sup> August. The Diocesan Synod elections have been notified to Deanery Synod members as well as in Diomail.

Because Deanery Synod members are the voters for the Diocesan Synod elections, people sometimes think that they are the only people who can stand in the elections. This is not the case. Any lay person can stand for election who is 16 or older, is on the electoral roll of a Parish and attends church services reasonably regularly. They need to be nominated and seconded by lay members of their Deanery Synod and submit a nomination form to there Area Dean by 12 noon on Friday 14<sup>th</sup> June 2024.

Nomination forms can be obtained from myself or your Area Dean. Or the Deanery Synod Rep from your church should also have received the relevant information including the nomination form.
